Executive Summary

District Strategic Plan 2025

Orange County Public Schools is the ninth-largest school district in the United States and the fourth largest in Florida. The district serves more than 206,000 students at 202 schools and is one of the largest employers in Central Florida with more than 25,000 team members.

Vision: To ensure every student has a promising and successful future.

Mission: With the support of families and the community, we create enriching and diverse pathways to lead our students to success.

School Collection Development Plan

Gotha Middle School serves 1053 students enrolled in grades sixth through eighth. The student population's ethnicity is made up of 31%% Hispanic and 69% Non-Hispanic students. Additionally, we serve a diverse population made up of 56% White, 34% Black, 1% Native, 5% Asian, 1% Pacific, and 3% Multicultural students.

The administration includes Principal Monica Emery and Assistant Principal Mr. Coner. Gotha Middle School is proud to offer the many special programs which provide students with opportunities. These include chess club, drama club, Battle of the Books, Harry Potter club, YMCA cooking program.

A thorough analysis of the current media center collection at Gotha Middle School indicates that the average age of the collection is 2008 and the number of books per student is 12. The <u>American Association for School Libraries</u> has established a criteria for a highly effective media center that includes a ratio of 15-20 books available per student in the collection.

At this time, Gotha Middle School does not meet the recommended standards for the number of books per student.

The analysis of the collection also revealed the following areas of strengths and concerns:

- Need current technology and science books
- Need to increase collection for Portuguese, Haitian, Spanish
- Social studies books in the library have an average age of 2007 and should be updated
- Biographies in the library have an average age of 2005 and should be updated
